Leaf Prints

Let's make leaf prints using two different art materials!

Step one:

Collect leaves. Fallen or fresh should both work!

Step two:

For painting, choose your first leaf and turn it over so that you paint the surface with the bumpy veins on. Cover the whole area.

Step three:

Turn it over onto the paper and firmly press down on it for a few seconds.

Step four:

Slowly lift from one edge and have a look at your painted print!

Step five:

For crayon leaf printing, choose a leaf and place vein-side up underneath a piece of paper.

Step six:

Rub a crayon over the paper to reveal the print.
